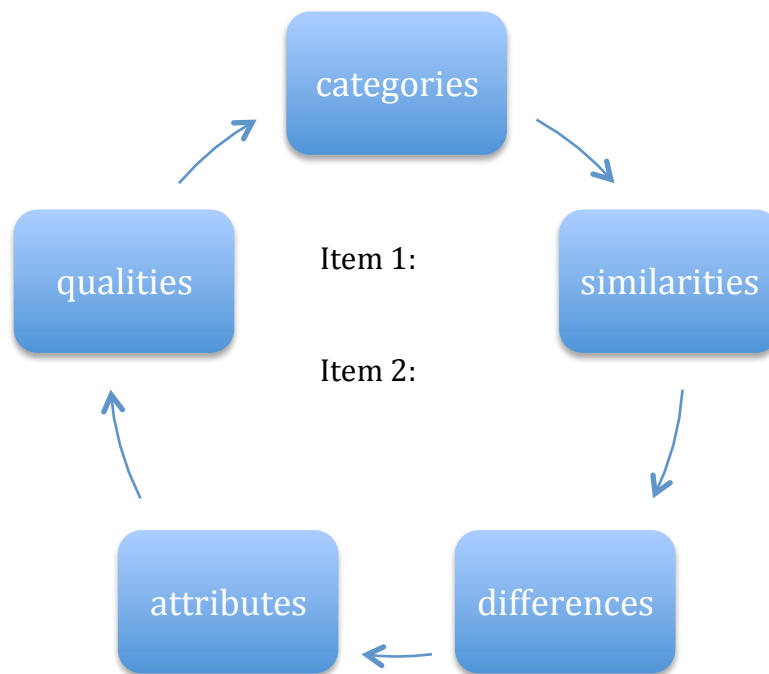


Key Questions that Drive Compare/Contrast:

6. What are the most important qualities or attributes that make the items different?
7. In terms of the qualities that are most important, are the items more alike or more different?
