## **Alternative Texts**

The alternative texts approach is a critical literacy strategy that teaches students to view text from multiple perspectives. Here are a couple of these approaches:

## **Character Substitution:**

- 1. Students write about a portion of what they read with a character substitution, replacing an existing character with a new character of a different personality.
- 2. Have students write out the events as they would play out with the new character, if even a different outcome.
- 3. Discuss these variations as a class, and how or what changed as a result. Focus on bias, judgment, and point-of-view.

## **Character Perspective:**

- 1. Have students re-write a story or portion of a story or book using another character's perspective.
- 2. Instruct them to reorient the facts and events to fit the desires of the new character.
- 3. Characters may also be students' relatives, friends, or characters from another book read previously.
